In 1920 one of the generous contributors of books to the Club library offered also a bookplate, and asked Frances Grimes, a fellow member, to design it. The consensus of opinion was that, given the horsy atmosphere in which we had been born and bred, and the devotion to the Muses that we professed, no symbol would be more appropriate than a horse, and precisely the Muses' winged horse Pegasus. So Pegasus, first our bookplate, became in 1931 our Club emblem, appearing ever since on all our printed matter.

In addition, our Club motto Vivida vis Animi underscores the "Vigor of Mind".
